Headlice


We have a number of cases of head lice in the school. Please regularly check your child's head and if they have head lice, please treat and send back to school.

As a celebration of Kindergarten finishing their first year of school, students will be presented with a book. This presentation will occur during the Infants Christmas concert.



Thirring-Nunna 'thir-ring-nun-na' is a hide and seek game that is played by the Aboriginal children in Queensland.



One player is the 'seeker' and the other players hide. Once hidden, the players are not allowed to move from their hiding places.

The seeker searches for the hidden players.

When players are found they can help the 'seeker' to find the other players.
