arrived!


Jaxon: I liked making the pizza, we all had fun

Staff Development Day reminder

A reminder to all parents that students are returning to school on Tuesday 26th of April, as the Staff Development Day has been moved to the end of the year.

ANZAC DAY

ANZAC day falls on the last day of the holidays, but we are encouraging as many students as possible to meet us at 10am at Mitre 10 on Monday the 25th to participate in the ANZAC March with the school. Students will need to be in full school summer uniform.

Excursion Payments

Please remember that excursion payments can be accepted at the office from now onwards to make it easier than paying the whole amount at once.

COVID Intervention

Mrs Lizz Denovan has accepted a position in our school, for the remainder of the year for 5/6, meaning that Mrs Belinda Foran will be able to return to the COVID Intervention program.

Covid intervention will start again next term, with selected students working with Mrs Foran at various times throughout the day. If your student is part of this program you will be contacted early next term.

COVID Reminders

Reminder for those who are close or household contacts

If a person in your household tests positive to COVID-19, they must self-isolate away from everyone else in the house for 7 days from the date of their positive test. They must follow the advice for people testing positive to COVID-19, which includes how to self-isolate effectively. If the person is unable to safely self-isolate by themselves (e.g. due to their young age), a parent or carer should self-isolate with them.

The entire household must also self-isolate for 7 days from the date of the positive person's test. They should follow the advice for <u>people exposed to COVID-19</u> and <u>take a test</u> as soon as possible, have another test on Day 6, and at any time COVID-19 symptoms appear.

If another person in your household tests positive to COVID-19, that person must restart their 7 day self-isolation period from the date of their positive test, even if they don't have any symptoms.

Other household members who test negative do not need to re-start their 7 day self-isolation period. They also do not have to self-isolate again anytime in the following 14 days unless they test positive. People who test positive to COVID-19 and complete their 7-day self-isolation period do not have to test or self-isolate as any type of contact for 12 weeks after their release.

Self-isolation means staying at home or at your accommodation. This means you cannot drive your children to school or day care; you must ask someone else to do this. You must only leave self-isolation to get medical care or in an emergency. For more information, read the <u>self-isolation rules</u>.

What a huge start to the year. As the term comes to an end, I would like to take the opportunity to thank students, families and staff for their resilience and understanding. Students have worked extremely hard either at home, with different teachers, or in class as normal, throughout this term and should be extremely proud of themselves. Although it has been difficult at times, with staff and students away, we have managed to achieve a great deal this term. We have had students involved in; representing the school and the zone in swimming, various PSSA trail days, pop up restaurants, Equine Therapy, Swim School and various community-based excursions, all the while working hard in the classroom. Well done to all.

1. Be positive and intentional with your communication.

Intentionally make your interactions with nephews, nieces or your children's friends encouraging.

2. Seek out other father figures for your own children.

It's always good for your child to have other positive male role models in their life. Whether it's your mate, a sports coach or teacher.

3. Be a role model.

Children look up to positive male role models, each having a different impact on girls and boys.

- 4. Take other children along with your own children and take part in activities together like football, camping, dinner or movies
- <u>5. Where possible, encourage sole-parent mothers to consider appropriate father figures for their children, or, consider being one yourself.</u>

Perhaps your partner has a friend who is the sole-parent. Being a positive male role model in a child's life makes a big difference.

Parents are welcome to attend. Please enter via Hall Gate.


