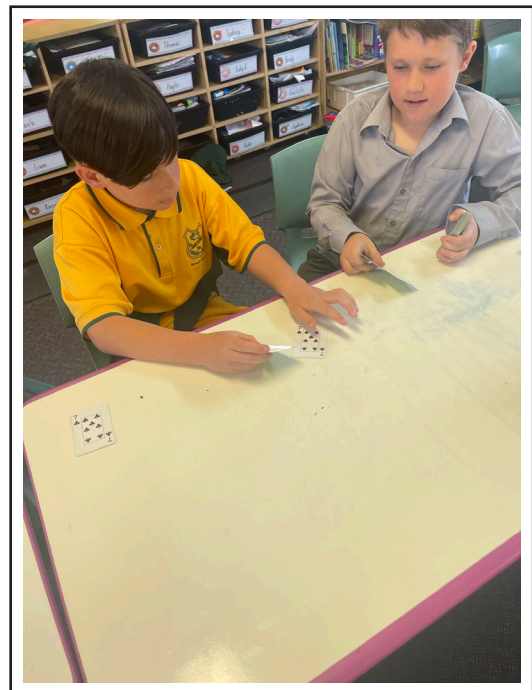
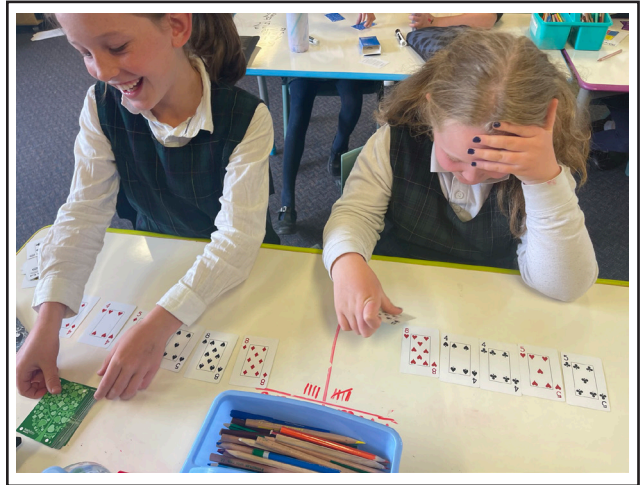


Maths in 3/4D

EXCURSION REMINDERS

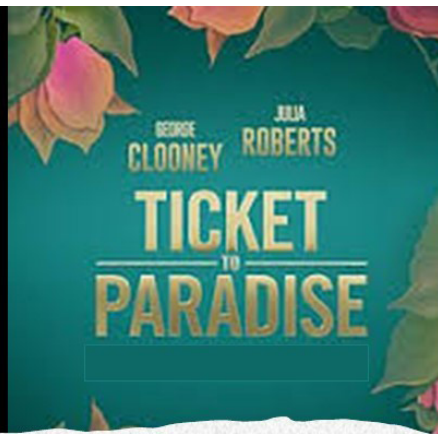
