# IN CLASS WITH STAGE 1S



We looked at information about koalas and other native animals and the threats that they experience from natural disasters (like bushfires) and from man-made threats such as land clearing.


Students then created a persuasive text about why it is important to protect koalas and the steps to take in order to do this.


Stage 1S learnt a lot about what makes koalas so special and why we need to protect them.














## KNOCKOUT NETBALL

A big thank you to all the parents, staff and supporters who came out to cheer on our teams. Your encouragement means the world to our students and helps foster a love of sport and community spirit.


















## LIBRARY NEWS

#### **Excursions**

We are pleased to inform you that the costs for the upcoming excursions for Stage 2 and Stage 3 students have been finalised. The excursion prices have climbed due to having to get buses from Singleton.

**Stage 3 Excursion**: \$450 per student **Stage 2 Excursion**: \$200 per student

These prices reflect a 50% of the actual fee per student, thanks to the substantial subsidies provided by the school. To facilitate participation, we have been encouraging families to begin making payments in smaller amounts each week. The alternative option is becoming involved in the P&C to receive \$50 P&C money that can be used with anything inside the school including excursions.

Please be advised that a non-refundable deposit will be required early in Term 3 to confirm your child's participation in the excursion. It is imperative that all payments are completed prior to the excursion date, as students who have not finalised their payments will not be able to attend.
